Coming into the role of a new Board Member would be required to read a lot, listen, and learn. If you have worked in the District before, or have children who attend CPS schools, the governance role requires a whole different perspective and skill set. There are lots of briefings and materials to read during orientation to learn about the many departments, complex systems, and school level work of CPS. There are also lots of materials to read monthly in preparation for Committee and Board meetings. Board Members need to take time to listen to community meetings and listen to staff on subject matter to ensure they have the information they need to make informed decisions.

If there is a student who meets all of the requirements to be elected or appointed Board Member, they would be eligible to serve in these capacities.

Additionally, the CPS Board of Education has an Honorary Board Member position. This position is honorary and carries no salary. It is a public position and allows for a point of contact for the community. It is not a capacity.
